The Constitution, originally comprising seven articles, delineates the national frame of government. Its first three articles embody the doctrine of the separation of powers, whereby the federal government is divided into three branches: the legislative, consisting of the bicameral Congress; the executive, consisting of the President; and the judicial, consisting of the Supreme Court and other federal courts. Articles Four, Five and Six embody concepts of federalism, describing the rights and responsibilities of state governments and of the states in relationship to the federal government. Article Seven establishes the procedure subsequently used by the thirteen States to ratify it. It is regarded as the oldest written and codified constitution in force of the world. When you simply read what Article I says - the actual words -- with the basic understanding of impeachment and history that was available to Americans of the Revolutionary War era - all known to the Convention of 1787 -- Congress has the Constitutional power to say to all Civil Officers - the

President and the Cabinet: "you're fired." Having a President who is "not up to the job" isn't just unwise - in today's world it's dangerous. Our Constitutional Convention of 1787 knew about human frailty and weakness - and provided far stronger safeguards against it than we have realized. Equally important -- We the People are the ultimate check and balance on Congress. If Congress starts to become too political - trying to "grab power from the Executive" instead of safeguarding us from the misuse or abuse of Executive power - We the People can and should throw out of office any members of Congress that are doing that. But... of course... then what!?! Power Without Responsibility Aug 27 2022 This book argues that Congress's process for making law is as corrosive to the nation as unchecked deficit spending. David Schoenbrod shows that Congress and the president, instead of making the laws that govern us, generally give bureaucrats the power to make laws through agency regulations. Our elected "lawmakers" then take credit for proclaiming popular but inconsistent statutory goals and later blame the inevitable burdens and disappointments on the unelected bureaucrats. The 1970 Clean Air Act, for example, gave the Environmental Protection Agency the impossible task of making law that would satisfy both industry and environmentalists. Delegation allows Congress and the president to wield power by pressuring agency lawmakers in private, but shed responsibility by avoiding the need to personally support or oppose the laws, as they must in enacting laws themselves. Schoenbrod draws on his experience as an attorney with the Natural Resources Defense Council and on studies of how delegation actually works to show that this practice produces a regulatory system so cumbersome that it cannot provide the protection that people need, so large that it needlessly stifles the economy, and so complex that it keeps the voters from knowing whom to hold accountable for the consequences. Contending that delegation is unnecessary and unconstitutional, Schoenbrod has written the first book that shows how, as a practical matter, delegation can be stopped.
