The University in Africa and Democratic Citizenship Apr 03 2020 Whether and how higher education in Africa contributes to democratisation beyond producing the professionals that are necessary for developing and sustaining a modern political system, remains an unresolved question. This report, then, represents an attempt to address the question of whether there are university specific mechanisms or pathways by which higher education contributes to the development of democratic attitudes and behaviours among students, and how these mechanisms operate and relate to politics both on and off campus. The findings suggest that the identified risks of the CDS market are numerous and particularly detrimental in times of financial crises, which call for effective future policy arrangements. In the following part, I turn the focus towards new regulatory requirements in the CDS market (see Chapter III). In particular, I analyze the design of central counterparties (CCPs) and assess their impact on CDS market participants. The results suggest that CCPs face a delicate.
